

























Bush Roses:









Traditional Hybrid Tea Roses, Grandiflora, and Floribunda roses for cut flowers, and garden color.




	<p>All Dressed Up <i>Grandiflora 2019</i> Old fashioned look, with modern disease resistance! Long stems are great for cutting. Mild tea fragrance, non-fading pink blooms.</p>
	<p>All My Loving <i>Hybrid Tea 2017</i> Deep pink, fragrant blooms are high centered and perfect for cutting. Long stems, and good vigor guarantees profuse flower production.</p>
	<p>Angel Face <i>Floribunda 1968</i> Loads of ruffled lavender blossoms with a strong perfume of sweet citrus flowers. A perennial favorite because of the low bushy habit, the nearly continual production of blooms, the unusual color, and the sweet fragrance.</p>
	<p>Arctic Blue <i>Floribunda 2019</i> Lilac pink fading to lavender blue, with a cream reverse. Medium sized blooms, with full petals and a moderate fruity fragrance.</p>
	<p>Barbra Streisand <i>Hybrid Tea 2001</i> Chosen by Barbra herself, this bush has large shapely lavender blooms, with darker purple edges. Great cutting rose and wonderful fragrance.</p>
	<p>Blue Girl <i>Hybrid Tea 1964</i> This "blue" rose is a unique, highly sought-after shade of silvery blue-lavender. Classic high pointed blooms are very fragrant. Susceptible to common rose diseases.</p>
	<p>Brandy <i>Hybrid Tea 1982</i> Very lovely large classically formed flowers possess the richest apricot color yet in roses. Requires protection in harsh climates. Established plants give the most bloom. Best when cool.</p>









	<p>Burst of Joy NEW! <i>Floribunda 2020</i> Vivid blooms are bright orange with a yellow reverse - an eye-popping combination that is sure to knock you over. Quite long-lasting, both in a vase and on the bush</p>
	<p>Celestial Night <i>Floribunda 2019</i> Plum-purple blooms with a raspberry pink reverse. High petal count, and old-fashioned look with incredibly good disease resistance. Mild fragrance</p>
	<p>Chrysler Imperial <i>Hybrid Tea 1953 AARS Winner</i> Large blooms with perfect form, rich deep burgundy red color, and a fragrance to die for! This rose is a personal favorite. Best disease resistance in inland areas.</p>
	<p>Distant Drums <i>Floribunda 2003</i> Distant Drums grows much like a Floribunda in habit, drumming out clusters of pointed brunette buds that swirl open to reveal ruffles washed with orchid pink. All this set to music against dark green foliage.</p>
	<p>Doris Day <i>Floribunda 2015</i> Bright yellow blooms with a strong spicy fragrance. Very floriferous, with good disease resistance. Medium sized, bushy growth habit.</p>
	<p>Double Delight <i>Hybrid Tea 1977 AARS Winner</i> The red and ivory color alone is a winner, but the powerful fragrance will make it your favorite. Susceptible to common rose problems, but worth the effort.</p>
	<p>Drop Dead Red <i>Floribunda 2010</i> Velvety red blooms are fade resistant, and plentiful. Good disease resistance, mild fragrance. Glossy green foliage.</p>
	<p>Easy Does It <i>Floribunda 2010 AARS Winner</i> Peachy pink suffused with mango orange clusters of ruffled blooms atop healthy disease resistant foliage. Moderate fragrance.</p>








	<p>Easy Spirit <i>Floribunda 2018</i> This pretty no-fuss white rose will produce nice, well-formed blooms all year. It is disease resistant, fragrant, and has a nice compact upright growth habit.</p>
	<p>Falling in Love <i>Hybrid Tea 2006</i> Large classically shaped buds open to shades of warm pink and white. Great cut flower with long stems and strong fragrance.</p>
	<p>Firefighter <i>Hybrid Tea 2009</i> A big super-fragrant long-stemmed rich-red Hybrid Tea. Each plant sold will contribute toward the fund's effort to honor the victims of 9-11. Cooler temps give the best red color.</p>
	<p>First Prize <i>Hybrid Tea 1970 AARS Winner</i> ENORMOUS high centered, pink, and white blended blooms atop tall bushy plants. Another personal favorite. Mild fragrance. Good disease resistance inland, moderate on coast.</p>
	<p>Fragrant Cloud <i>Hybrid Tea 1968</i> Captivating well-formed coral-range—sometimes clove, often spicy, sweet, and mostly rose. Lots of large shapely blooms are produced on a vigorous bushy plant with dark glossy green foliage.</p>
	<p>Fragrant Plum <i>Grandiflora 1990</i> Tall, long-stemmed lavender blooms are perfect for cutting. Strong fragrance and moderate disease resistance.</p>
	<p>Full Sail <i>Hybrid Tea 2001</i> Great glossy foliage, beautiful flower form. But best of all, it has that heady honeysuckle perfume that will make you swoon with just one sniff. Opens best when temps are consistent. Best flower size when cool.</p>
	<p>Gingersnap <i>Floribunda 1978</i> Clusters of ruffled flowers in dazzling tones of orange and copper. Rounded bushy habit. Mild fragrance.</p>








	<p>Gold Medal <i>Grandiflora 1983</i> Pretty butter yellow blooms with pink/orange tips on tall, strong stems. Strong fragrance, and good disease resistance.</p>
	<p>Good as Gold <i>Hybrid Tea 2014</i> Large golden amber-orange colored blooms with a citrus-like fragrance. Tall upright bushy plant, with clean dark green foliage.</p>
	<p>Grande Dame <i>Hybrid Tea 2011</i> A true modern antique rose with a strong old rose fragrance, heavily petaled blooms, and low thorned stems. Deep rose-pink flowers, vigorous shrubby grown habit</p>
	<p>Heirloom <i>Hybrid Tea 1972</i> Magenta buds open to tones of lilac and lavender. Blooms are set on sturdy stems, powerful fragrance.</p>
	<p>Henry Fonda <i>Hybrid Tea 1996</i> Immensely popular, Henry Fonda boasts distinctly deep yellow blossoms surrounded by deep green and clean foliage. This rose shows remarkable vigor and disease resistance all season.</p>
	<p>Iceberg <i>Floribunda 1958</i> This is one of the top performers of all time. Bushy and nearly thornless, it produces clusters of white flowers nonstop. It is the top seller every year</p>
	<p>Ingrid Bergman <i>Hybrid Tea 1984</i> A beautiful deep red rose with nice form, and good rebloom. The bush is on the smaller side, but the blooms are large. Moderate fragrance.</p>
	<p>Intrigue <i>Floribunda 1984</i> Deep purple-red bud and velvety plum flower color. It pleases the nose as well with a powerful perfume of citrus and rose. Dark green leaves enrobe the bushy rounded plant.</p>

	<p>John F Kennedy <i>Hybrid Tea 1965</i> Slow opening, pointed white blooms honor our 35th President. Moderate fragrance, heavily petaled blooms stand up to hot weather.</p>
	<p>Julia Child <i>Floribunda 2006 AARS Winner</i> Bright golden yellow blooms boast a strong fragrance, and prolific, vigorous habit. Very disease resistant, and floriferous. Excellent in the San Diego area.</p>
	<p>Just Joey <i>Hybrid Tea 1972</i> Exceptionally large, ruffled apricot blooms, with a pleasing strong fragrance. Red tinted foliage.</p>
	<p>Ketchup & Mustard <i>Floribunda 2012</i> One side of the petal is ketchup red, the other mustard yellow on this eye-catching floribunda. Nice, rounded plant with glossy foliage.</p>
	<p>Koko Loko <i>Floribunda 2012</i> Soft lavender blossom. Early to bloom, every lovely bud spiral opens with impeccable show form. The flowers last long on the plant & in the vase. Beyond its novelty, there lies a great plant... rounded, handsome & bushy...chock full of green leaves. Warm weather brings out the lavender.</p>
	<p>Lasting Love <i>Hybrid Tea 1993</i> Large dark reddish pink blooms with a powerful fragrance. Strong stems, and glossy foliage make this a great plant. Heat tolerant.</p>
	<p>Life of the Party <i>Floribunda 2019</i> Yellow old-fashioned looking rose, with pink tips. Strong fruity fragrance. Upright bushy growth with glossy green foliage.</p>
	<p>Livin Easy <i>Floribunda 1996 AARS Winner</i> Bright clusters of apricot-orange blooms adorn a glossy disease resistant bushy plant. It could not be easier to get some great color in your garden! Moderate fragrance.</p>

	<p>Love <i>Grandiflora 1980</i> This red rose with a white reverse has been a florist's favorite for many years. It is a productive long-stemmed beauty, with best size and color in cooler weather. Slight fragrance.</p>
	<p>Love at First Sight NEW! <i>Hybrid Tea 2020</i> While most reach about 5–6' tall, this one stops at about 3' tall. Subtle bicoloring—red on the front of each petal that pales on the reverse—further enhances the rare shape. It has much cleaner foliage that makes it especially disease resistant.</p>
	<p>Love Song <i>Floribunda 2013</i> Loads of big, beautiful blooms can nearly cover this sultry siren. The lovely lavender old-fashioned flowers just seem to last and last. Underneath all that beauteousness is a bushy rounded plant clothed with great rich green leaves. Largest flower size in cool temps.</p>
	<p>Marilyn Monroe <i>Hybrid Tea 2003</i> The extraordinarily feminine creamy apricot color holds through from the long-pointed buds to the big buxom open blooms. A gown of deep green leaves graces the cutting length stems. The best apricot for hot weather.</p>
	<p>Memorial Day <i>Hybrid Tea 2004</i> Enormous old-fashioned full flowers saturated with super-strong classic old rose fragrance hit a note of fond memories for all. Long low-thorned stems are lushly adorned with clean green leaves. Just one flower perfumes an entire room. Thrives on heat. Very disease resistant.</p>
	<p>Midas Touch <i>Hybrid Tea 1994</i> Grows upright to 5 feet. It has dark green, semi-glossy foliage. Golden yellow color atop long cutting stems. With a lovely fruit fragrance and excellent garden performance. Great yellow rose for warm climates.</p>
	<p>Miss All-American Beauty <i>Hybrid Tea 1968</i> Deep hot pink. Large long-lasting blossoms filled with sweet rose perfume and set against huge leathery leaves. Consistent color. Best performance in warm weather.</p>

	<p>Miss Congeniality <i>Grandiflora 2016</i> Pure white centers with deep pink edges make this rose a real eye catcher. Moderate fragrance, good disease resistance. Upright busy growth.</p>
	<p>Mister Lincoln <i>Hybrid Tea 1965 AARS Winner</i> One of the best red roses ever. Tall, stately plants with strong stems. Large classically shaped blooms with a powerful fragrance. Good disease resistance.</p>
	<p>Neil Diamond <i>Hybrid Tea 2015</i> This tall, eye catching rose, pink and white striped, has an equally delicious fragrance. Heavy petaled, with classic form makes a great cut flower.</p>
	<p>Neptune <i>Hybrid Tea 2005</i> Big blossoms of luscious lavender tinged with just a touch of purple. Large glossy green leaves, good vigor, and strong vitality. Best bloom size in cooler temps.</p>
	<p>Oklahoma <i>Hybrid Tea 1964</i> With the same parents as the famous Mr. Lincoln Rose, this dark red beauty boasts similar fragrance and form. Best disease resistance inland.</p>
	<p>Oregon <i>Hybrid Tea 1975</i> Deep yellow color of the big, pointed buds and large finely formed flowers is certainly a beauty to behold. The glossy polished dark green leaves make the blooms sparkle. Cool conditions improve color & size.</p>
	<p>Over the Moon <i>Hybrid Tea 2010</i> Warm apricot flowers with beautiful form open slowly. Bushy, healthy foliage, above average disease resistance. We were pleasantly surprised with this new introduction.</p>
	<p>Peace <i>Hybrid Tea 1946 AARS Winner</i> Perhaps the most famous rose of all, this yellow and pink blushed beauty has large double blooms with mild fragrance. It is heat tolerant, with decent disease resistance.</p>




	<p>Perfect Moment <i>Grandiflora 1991 AARS Winner</i> The deep yellow dipped in red ignites the landscape. Large flowers have good form and last long in vases. Good disease resistance inland.</p>
	<p>Perfume Delight <i>Hybrid Tea 1974 AARS Winner</i> Large, deep pink blooms are full and shapely. Strong fragrance, and average disease resistance.</p>
	<p>Pope John Paul II <i>Hybrid Tea 2013</i> Vigorous growth, bushy full habit, disease resistance, abundance of flower & perfect flower form. Produces large & luminous pure white blossoms with a delightful, fresh citrus fragrance. Flowers shine against the abundance of dark green foliage. Larger flower size in the cool spring. More pink in cooler conditions.</p>
	<p>Pretty Lady Rose <i>Hybrid Tea 2016</i> Compact upright growth, with large old-fashioned ruffled blooms in a long lasting deep pink color. Moderate fragrance</p>
	<p>Queen of Elegance NEW! <i>Floribunda 2020</i> Deep pink. Strong rose fragrance. 'Koko Loco' and 'Life of the Party' put together. She has the most beautiful fading color like her mom Koko and is a rose fit for royalty.</p>
	<p>Radiant Perfume <i>Grandiflora 2005</i> Stunning deep yellow blooms, with a strong citrus fragrance. Good cut flower.</p>
	<p>Rock & Roll <i>Grandiflora 2009</i> Each petal unfurls to reveal a different pattern of striped & splashed burgundy, red & ivory. Deep green leaves set the stage & clothe the bushy full plant. Great for cutting, for smelling or just for enjoying. Flower size best in the cool spring and fall.</p>

	<p>Rosie the Riveter <i>Floribunda 2018</i> Orange-gold suffused with pink. Pointy and shapely buds are proudly held on top of very glossy dark foliage as a feminine symbol of charm and strength. Moderate fruity & spice fragrance.</p>
	<p>Sentimental <i>Floribunda 1997</i> Spice scented. Burgundy-splashed-white, some more cream-swirled-red—all on the same vigorous plant. Distinctive clean quilted foliage. Best color & size in moderate temps. Perfect for potpourri.</p>
	<p>Secret <i>Hybrid Tea 1994 AARS Winner</i> Beautiful large white rose with pink edges. Lovely form, and good vigor. Fabulous fragrance. Above average disease resistance. Good cut flower.</p>
	<p>Sedona <i>Hybrid Tea 2010</i> Pointed, sculptured buds spiral open revealing layers of colors – reds, corals, and orange tones—to stunning 5-inch blossoms.</p>
	<p>Sparkle & Shine <i>Floribunda 2013</i> Great clusters of flowers on a rounded bushy plant. However, the improved update notches it up with brighter, longer-lasting yellow color, bigger flowers, glossier foliage, handsome dark new red growth & vastly improved disease resistance. Great as an easy care flowerful hedge.</p>
	<p>St Patrick <i>Hybrid Tea 1996 AARS Winner</i> Large light yellow-green flowers open slowly. Strong stems make it a good cut flower. Slight fragrance, bushy habit. Heat tolerant. Average disease resistance.</p>
	<p>State of Grace NEW! <i>Grandiflora 2020</i> State of Grace is a beautiful multicolored rose with shades of pink to gold and copper. In our trial gardens this past year she has been a standout and excellent cut flower. She will add elegance and old-world style and grace to any garden.</p>

	<p>Sugar Moon <i>Hybrid Tea 2012</i> A SUPER fragrant pure white rose. Large, classically formed blooms atop an upright bushy plant. Long stems are great for cutting.</p>
	<p>Trumpeter <i>Floribunda 1977</i> Brilliant scarlet colors of the long-lasting ruffled blossoms blare out against the disease-resistant glossy green foliage. Naturally compact and bushy, put him in the front row of your garden. Great in mass plantings. Good landscape performer. Likes a little heat. Hardy.</p>
	<p>Twilight Zone <i>Grandiflora 2013</i> Big buds open to very double old-fashioned flowers of deep velvet purple overlaid with a wisp of smoke. Strongly scented with a combination of clove & lemony citrus blossom. Deep green leaves cover the plant & compliment the remarkably colored flowers. More purple in moderate temps.</p>
	<p>Veteran's Honor <i>Hybrid Tea 2013</i> Big shapely buds unfurl perfectly into huge blossoms with stunning red color. Extra-long cutting stems, perfect for picking up a few blue ribbons or making a grand bouquet just for you. Best flower size in the cool of spring.</p>
	<p>Violet's Pride <i>Floribunda 2017</i> Full, double blooms in small clusters. Lavender with a magenta center. Strong fragrance, vigorous rounded growth.</p>
	<p>We Salute You <i>Hybrid Tea 2007</i> Large flowers with orange on the inside & warm pink on the outside. Carried on long stems with very deep green highly glossed leaves. Warm weather brings out the best flower colors.</p>





CLIMBING ROSES:

Climbing roses are terrific for providing loads of color throughout the year. All will require some support, either ties, or trellises. Prune climbing roses differently, leaving the tall canes, and just trim back the lateral branches.

	<p>Cécile Brunner <i>Patio Climber 1894</i> (Sweetheart rose) (Climbing Polyantha) Beloved old-timer. Large airy clusters of small pointed pastel buds and creamy pink blooms. Mostly a spring bloomer on old wood. Old fashioned. Established plants give more rebloom.</p>
	<p>Joseph's Coat <i>Large Flowered Climber 1964</i> Immensely popular climber with multicolored blooms of orange, yellow, red, and pink. Blooms on new and old wood. Canes reach 10'-12'.</p>
	<p>Tropical Lightning <i>Climber 2017</i> Sunset-like orange while the dazzling lightning is generated by bright cream stipes. Reaches mature size and full display in 3 years, will only slow down the flowering as it transitions into winter. Tropical Lightning presents some of the glossiest leaves of all roses. Add the dark burgundy red coloration of the new shoots.</p>










GROUNDCOVER ROSES:











Groundcovers roses grow typically 18"- 24" tall and spread 3'-4' wide. They are great for a splash of color in the yard, and do not require precision pruning. Prune lightly after bloom to encourage rebloom, and then a bit harder in the winter.

	<p>Red Ribbons <i>Groundcover 1990</i> Nicely sized showy flowers come in large clusters to drape over a wall or spill from a standard. The color holds to the very end. Clean doubly dark glossy green leaves round out the display on this super vigorous gem. Very consistent in all climates.</p>
	<p>Sunset Happy Trails NEW! <i>Groundcover 2020</i> Happy Trails groundcover roses are low and spreading and will trail down a slope. Sunset Happy Trails™ is a prostrate grower with branches low and spreading on the ground. Blooms are salmon fading to light pink. Repeat blossoms are 1.5</p>
	<p>Sunshine Happy Trails <i>Groundcover 2016</i> Buttery yellow blooms in medium sized clusters Stays low and spreading. Moderate fragrance.</p>
	<p>White Meidiland <i>Groundcover 1987</i> Large, heavily petaled pure white blooms on this low growing rose. No fragrance. Glossy foliage.</p>

TREE ROSES:

Our tree roses are Grade 1, 36" standard double grafted roses. Tree roses need extra care if planted bare root, but if planted as a rooted container plant, they are just as easy as bush roses.
